


<p><u>English</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make a list of ways sticks can be used. • Write instructions for playing 'Pooh Sticks'. • Write a new part for the story where an animal or person use Stickman for something else. • Write postcards from Stickman to his family. • Make a list of movement words used in the book, can you add any other words? • Write a new story about Stickman and his family or your own Stickman adventure. 	<p><u>Maths</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Collect sticks - how many did you collect? How long is your stick? • Compare your stick with another stick - is your stick the longest or shortest? • Find things longer and shorter than your stick. • Build numbers using sticks for 10's and stones for 1's. • Build digits out of sticks. 	
<p><u>Science</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The animals in the story build nests - what other animals build nests? • Stickman floats - investigate floating and sinking. 	<p><u>PSHE</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Look at Stickman's facial expressions - How is he feeling? Can you make the same expressions? 	<p><u>Computing</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make a stop motion video using sticks and homemade background pictures. • Use 'Pivot Animator' to make a 'stick figure' animation.

<p><u>History/Geography</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make a timeline of the events in the story (seasons, time of day, celebrations). • Record on a homemade map where you found your sticks. • Draw a map of Stickman's adventure in his story or your own adventure. 	<p><u>Art</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Using natural materials (sticks/leaves), make your own stick people and take photos. • Make your own family tree. • Turn stick photos into cartoon characters. • Draw faces with different facial expressions - sketch a family member or use a mirror. 	<p><u>D&T</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Design and build a sandcastle - Think about its parts - how can you make it strong? -what could you use if you do not have sand? • Design and make a toy out of natural materials. • Make a stick puppet - take it on an adventure - take photos - write a story.
