Weekly Update

I love the diversity of the learning that happens over our sites in the space of one week. This week we have seen our youngest learners traipsing around the school grounds whilst 'Going on a Bear Hunt.' Our Year 5s were visited by the local Fire Fighters. They also created their own potions using their knowledge of soluble materials. Year 2 have been using clay to create the most phenomenal dragon's eyes based on their detailed drawings. Year 6 have had a visit from out Trust's Safeguarding Lead alongside a local PC who have been discussing how to keep themselves safe. Positive Behaviours Policy

Monday saw the launch of our new Henry Hinde Positive Behaviours Policy on both of our sites.

What has stayed the same?

KS2 pupils will continue to collect House Points/Dojos but the levels and totals have changed. Certificates have also been introduced.

The Good to be Green charts will no longer be used.

Weekly celebration assemblies continue to take place each Friday on both sites.

A staged approach to sanctions will continue but the sanctions have changed.

What has changed?

The pegs are back at Grenville...EY & KS1 pupils will receive silver pegs as a sign of recognition. The Golden Trolley has moved to Grenville.

Henry Hinde Inspiration has been introduced to recognise pupils who do not receive a stage 3 consequence each week.

You will now receive notification of stage 3 consequences and above via Parentmail.

KS2 Recognition afternoon will take place on the last afternoon of term and activities will be linked to individual House Point achievements.

Adaptations

It is inevitable that some children may find it more challenging than others to follow a behaviour policy. They may have difficulties which require intervention from outside agencies or the Special Educational Needs and Disability Coordinator (SENDCo). Where necessary the class teachers and other key staff will make adaptations to ensure that individual behaviour support plans are in place.



Rewards and Recognition



We want children to be proud of their own efforts and be motivated by their own achievements. Our rewards are linked intrinsically to learning behaviours rather than just achievements.

Pupils who have been awarded a new achievement level during that term will be able to pick from a menu of activities depending on the level of their latest award. e.g. A pupil who has achieved Iron level will have access to the Iron activity. A pupil who has achieved Bronze level will be able to pick from the activity offered at Bronze level but also from Copper and Iron. A pupil who has achieved Gold level will be able to pick from the activity offered at Gold level but also from Sllver, Bronze, Copper and Iron.
