Samuel Pepys 1633-1703

Samuel kept a diary throughout the course of the fire. He documented the spread of the flames from his home across the River Thames. He informed King Charles that London was on fire. He buried cheese and wine in his garden which he intended to dig up after the fire as they were expensive items.

1. The fire started on Sunday 2nd September 1666.


2. The fire started in a bakery in Pudding Lane, London.

5. There was no fire brigade so people had to use leather buckets full of water to help to stop the fire.


