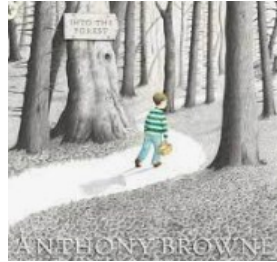

Why are bees important for flowering plants?

## Parts of a flowering plant



**Flower** - this part is pretty and attracts bees. The flower has petals.

**Stem** - the stem carries water through the plant and helps it stand up tall.

**Leaves** - the leaves are the food system, using the sun to make food for the plant.

**Roots** - the roots help to keep the plant in place in the ground. They also suck up food for the plant from the soil to help it grow.
