Changes

It is entirely possible that, after two very long years, this may be the last time I write to you in relation to COVID updates. (I think we all certainly hope so anyway!)

You will have no doubt heard the Prime Minister during half term laying out his plans in relation to 'Living with COVID-19'. Clearly this has implications in relation to how we will now be operating within our schools and I have waited for clarification from the DfE and unions before relaying this information to you all.

For simplicity, I have copied and pasted the relevant extracts in relation to the chronology of changes as they impact us in school below:

"From Monday 21st February, the Government is removing the guidance for staff and students in most education and childcare settings to undertake twice-weekly asymptomatic testing."

"From Thursday 24th February, the Government will remove the legal requirement to self-isolate following a positive test. Adults and children who test positive will continue to be advised to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for at least 5 full days, and then continue to follow the guidance until they have received 2 negative test results on consecutive days.

In addition, the Government will:

- No longer ask fully vaccinated close contacts and those aged under 18 to test daily for 7 days, and remove the legal requirement for close contacts who are not fully vaccinated to self-isolate.
- End routine contact tracing. Contacts will no longer be required to self-isolate or advised to take daily tests. Staff, children and young people should attend their education settings as usual. This includes staff who have been in close contact within their household, unless they are able to work from home.
- End the legal obligation for individuals to tell their employers when they are required to self-isolate."

"From Friday 1st April, the Government will:

- Remove the current guidance on voluntary COVID-status certification in domestic settings and no longer recommend that certain venues use the NHS COVID Pass.
- Update guidance setting out the ongoing steps that people with COVID-19 should take to minimise contact with other people. This will align with the changes to testing.
- No longer provide free to order universal symptomatic and asymptomatic testing for the general public in England.
- Consolidate guidance to the public and businesses, in line with public health advice."

May I take this opportunity to thank you all for your continued support, patience and understanding as we have jointly navigated two very difficult years together.

We are really excited to invite all the children to a school disco on March 25th.


We will be holding the disco across 2 sessions to ensure each session isn't too busy.
